- have good command of spoken and written English. If English is not their countries' official language, English language certificates should also be submitted for consideration;
- be in good health both physically and mentally. Pregnancy is regarded as a disqualifying condition for participation in the course.

V. Country Report

- a) Name of training course, participant, country

 - Number of personnel, education of the personnel
- c) General information
 - Introduction to participant's country and institution
 - Brief situation of dermatology field of the country
- d) Problems to be solved in dermatology field of the country
- e) Technical assistance received from other countries (in dermatology field)
- f) Summary/Conclusion

Each participant will be allocated 15 minutes for presentation of his/her country report and additional 5 minutes for comments and discussion in the first week of the course.
