## Objectives

### **At the end of the course, participants are expected to:**

- have an opportunity to compare drug laws enforcement, system laws and related laws of each participating country;
- learn how to improve and increase effectiveness on drug control, as well as, to promote future mutual cooperation among participating countries;
- learn and share their experiences in drug intelligence, drug law enforcement, mutual legal assistance and controlled delivery;
- learn more about international drug trade, illicit trafficking routes, as well as drug treatment and rehabilitation;
- realize the drug problems become more violent, in which, mutual cooperation should be improved;
- learn the sample of drug problems in Asia, especially in Thailand, that broadened their knowledge on the spreading of drugs;
- aware that the gained knowledge from the instructors was desirable and useful to their work against drugs.

## Qualifications

### **Participants for this course should:**

- be under forty (40) years of age;
- be university graduate, or to have the equivalent academic background;
- be narcotics law enforcement officer who are presently engaged in criminal justice administration;
- have practical experience in the related fields, however, to have at least 5 years experience is more preferable;
- have a good command of spoken and written English;
- be in good health to participate enthusiastically in all course activities, and should have a health certificate issued by an authorized physician. This certificate is required with the application form. Pregnancy is regarded as a disqualifying condition for participation in the course.

The country report highlights actual situation of drug trafficking, as well as effective countermeasures taken in their own country (15-20 minutes for each country). ### **V. GROUP WORKSHOP**

Participants will be divided into small groups to exchange views and experiences on selected issues. Each group is expected to make the conclusions and report of the discussion. The issue for the group workshops is Drug Law Enforcement.

### **VI. GROUP PRESENTATION**

Representative(s) from each group is subjected to make a presentation on their group conclusions. As a result, this will be the forum for all participants to share and express their experiences and comments to the class.
